3. MNO-OB Data

Screening – on paper until Mid Jan 2020, then in EMR

2019: Averaged 98.6% screened in OB

2020: 100% January to April

MAT/Recovery Program/Services –

- Detox services available - Behavioral Health
- Dr. Spishakoff consults for patients with SUD requiring Methadone or Buprenorphine
- Behavioral Health & Social Services consults for all patients presenting with SUD

Narcan – Narcan education for providers, staff and patients included in the MNO folders. Providers encouraged to prescribe Narcan for appropriate patients

4. MNO-OB Progress

Screening Tool – We are using the NIDA Single-Question Screening Test
Patients are screened in ED and in OB
We hosted an MNO Grand Rounds in June 2019. Staff from our private physician offices were invited and provided with packets, including screening tools, clinical care checklist and patient education. Packets were also sent to each office.

MNO-OB Folders – Folders are available at the nurses station. Folders include the Clinical Care Checklist, our algorithm, patient education material including breastfeeding and Narcan

Education Campaign –

- MNO background and goals
- Use of the screening tool and SBIRT
- Stigma and Bias education – OB & Behavioral Health RNs
- Eat, Sleep, Console education for all OB RNs
- Narcan education for all RNs

Monthly Review of all OUD Cases

- the team meets prior to the MNO-OB call and reviews cases, if any, with the use of the “Missed Opportunities” form.

5. AREAS FOR IMPROVEMENT - OB

Areas for Improvement:

- Staff use of the MNO folders, especially if patient presents to an area other than OB
- Private physician buy-in on use of the Clinical Care Checklist during prenatal care
