



### Screening Tools

The Institute for Health and Recovery 5 P's Integrated Screening Tool is given to all patients admitted to Labor and Delivery

### MNO-OB Folders

An informational binder has been placed on the unit with the OB Checklist and needed resources for patients identified with Opioids Use Disorder

### Education Campaign

Grand Rounds and Newsletters have been provided to nurses and all providers regarding the pillars of the initiative

### Monthly Review of all OUD Cases

We have relatively few cases of OUD compared to other locations but we are lucky enough to have MAT providers at most of our affiliated prenatal sites to assist patients with support and treatment.

## 5. IPLARC/IPAC or MNO Overflow

Due to religious constraints we are unable to provide IPLARC to the majority of our patients.

IPAC has allowed us to:

- Provide education to all patients regarding the Healthy Timing and Spacing of Pregnancy
- Provide education on contraceptive options including Natural Family Planning and LARC
- Provide all postpartum patients with a visit within 2 weeks of delivery
