Advocacy


Collaborative on Child Homelessness - Illinois (COCHI)

A multi-disciplinary, multi-organizational coalition with the purpose of improving health outcomes for young children, families, and pregnant persons experiencing housing insecurity by increasing capacity and fair access to housing through a deliberate racial equity and justice lens. COCHI defines housing insecurity as those who are literally homeless and those living doubled up.

LEAD SCREENING PROJECT


ICAAP leads education initiatives for healthcare providers and outreach on lead poisoning prevention in certain areas of Chicago.

Of approximately 237,000 children tested in Illinois in 2019, more than 7,000 had blood lead levels at the public health intervention level



CHILDHOOD IMMUNIZATIONS

ICAAP hosts monthly webinars for pediatric and adolescent healthcare providers who practice in private or public settings. Webinars cover best practices on relevant immunization topics, provides an overview of the relevant data, clinical information, common concerns among patients/caregivers, and health equity information, including disproportionately affected populations and how to increase uptake/access to immunizations. Outreach materials/social media images are created to compliment vaccine uptake activities around routine immunizations and flu vaccines.




The goal of Illinois Vaccinates Against COVID-19 (I-VAC) is to ensure COVID-19 vaccines are available as part of routine patient care across the state by supporting healthcare organizations, primary care clinicians, and non-medical staff involved in COVID-19 vaccine programs.

Learning Collaborative Sessions

A forum for healthcare providers to engage with peers and subject matter experts to help solve challenges related to COVID-19 testing, mitigation, vaccination and management.

Sessions are tailored to providers serving different patient populations.



I-VAC podcast: Beyond the Needle
To empower primary care clinicians to feel confident in implementing COVID-19
vaccinations so that their patients can receive the vaccine at a routine visit.
Features a variety of primary care clinicians/staff from across the state.

COVID-19 Vaccine Prioritization Project
Comprised of: 1. Current Vaccination Rate: 2. Community
Vulnerability and 3. Access. Score of 4 points is given to
the lowest quartiles that would be high-risk and therefore
indicative of requiring prioritization.
Example above: Ogle County, March 2022. Access to
Vaccines: 4; Vulnerability: 21; Vaccination Score: 4, TOTAL
SCORE: 30. County level reports are generated monthly.

REACH OUT & READ ILLINOIS

Reach Out & Read Illinois prepares low-income children for kindergarten by incorporating books into pediatric visits from six months to five years, connecting families to neighborhood resources and encouraging families to read together.

Reach Out & Read Illinois builds on the relationship between parents and healthcare providers. Books are an important part of early learning and brain development, and Reach Out & Read Illinois distributes early learning resources and over 142,00 books to families every year. Yet, this is only a fraction of those that need support.
