

Patient Cleared

Patient remains in Anteroom for duration of inpatient stay

- After delivery, if capacity does not allow for the patient to remain in the anteroom, patient should be transfered to room TN-370 or TN-377
- If no bed open in TN-370 or TN-377, patient should be placed in the furtherst west bed in Mitchell 3NW
- with at least one room separation from non-COVID-19 patient
- Patient can be discharged once obstetrically cleared • <u>Discharge instructions</u>
