Prioritization Matrix

Help your team prioritize the multiple tasks





What is a Prioritization Matrix?

- Sorts a diverse set of items based on order of importance
- Identifies relative importance by deriving a numerical value for the priority of each item
- Ranks items based on criteria your team deems important
- Structured & objective
- Achieve consensus on what to work on first

Displays the Initiative in Manageable Tasks

Key Driver Diagram

ESSI Bundle:

- **Awareness**: Parents or caregivers report an understanding of a safe sleep environment, including navigating challenges to safe sleep at home
- **Readiness**: Family is prepared for a transition to home, including SDoH screening and resource linkage
 - Transfer of Care: ESSI Newborn Care Plan (Awareness & Readiness) documented in the discharge

Creating your Priority matrix



1. Determine drivers/interventions/etc. to be evaluated

- Left column: Potential interventions
- List primary/<u>secondary drivers</u> from Key Driver Diagram

2. Determine your criteria & rating scale

2. Determine your criteria & rating scale

- What is important to you? (Choose 2-6 criteria)
- Consider:
 - Should each value + or from total numerical value?
 - Should have same number + and values
 - How important is it? Assign a rating scale (e.g., 1-10)




