OB- Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) Protocol

Brief Summary of Procedure

Procedure

A. If patient screens positive for OUD and is not on medication assisted therapy (MAT):

1. Obtain order for Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) order set
2. Begin or continue OUD Clinical Care Checklist
3. OB provider or OB Hospitalist (if on consult) will provide screening, brief intervention and referral to treatment (SBIRT)
4. If patient is willing, offer treatment options for MAT
5. If admitted, observer for withdrawal symptoms

B. If patient screens positive for OUD and is on MAT:

1. Obtain order for Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) order set
2. Begin or continue OUD Clinical Care Checklist
3. Continue MAT treatment while admitted to hospital

C. Education

1. Educate mother on the care of the newborn with neonatal abstinence syndrome (NAS). Refer to Eat, Sleep, Console (ESC) protocol.
2. Provide education on MAT treatment and near by treatment centers
3. Provide Narcan education

D. Discharge

1. Request order for Narcan nasal spray
2. Offer Med-to-Bed program for Rx
3. If patient declines treatment, provide a list of MAT treatment centers

Med-to-Bed allows patients to receive Narcan from our outpatient pharmacy. Narcan will be delivered to her bed. This helps reduce stigma and assures the patient fills the prescription.
