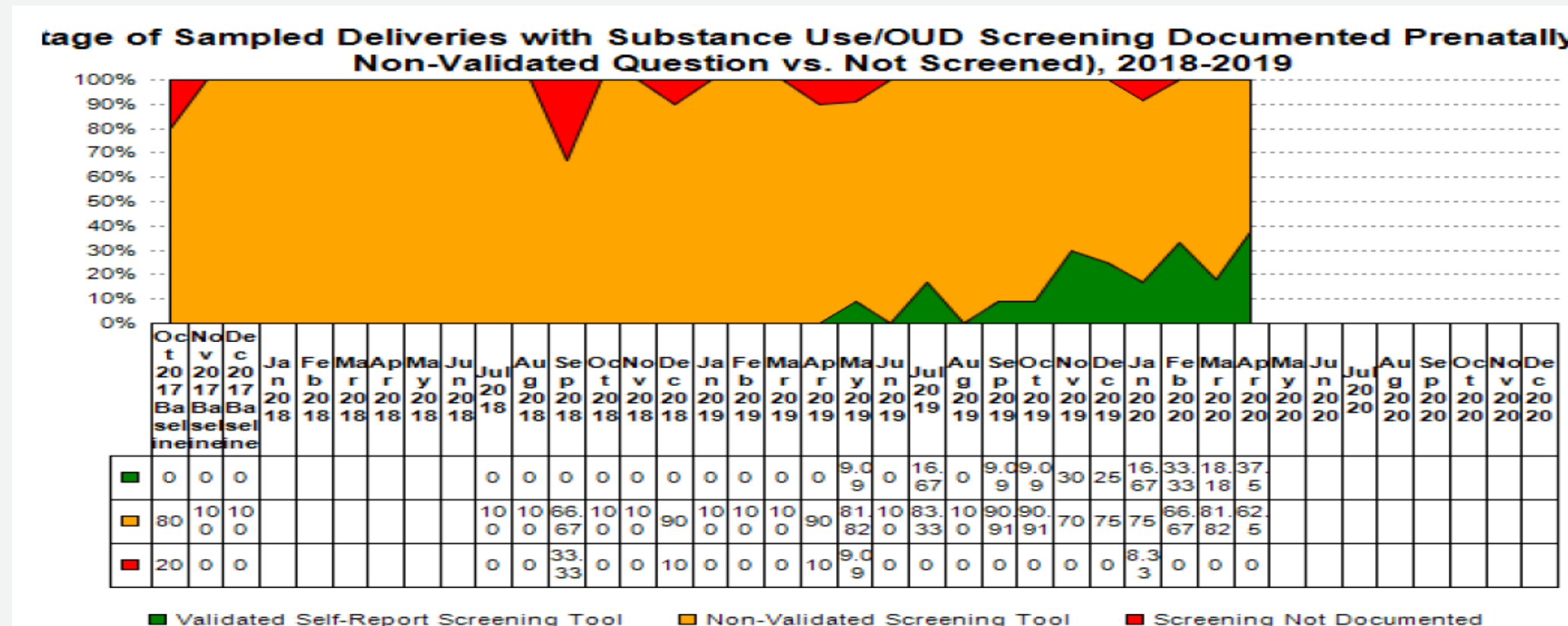

Moving Forward

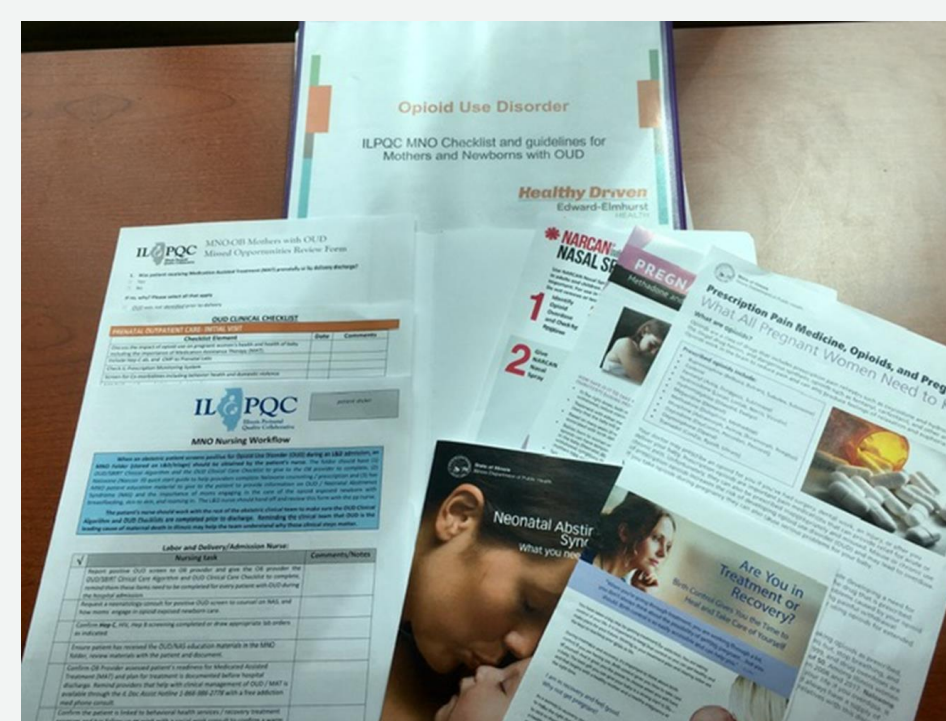
- Continued Annual Education of MNO
- Continued emphasis of the importance of Narcan prescribing for OUD moms
- Monthly MNO updates at OB meeting
- Case Reviews/Debrief of all OUD patients in real-time, Staff and CPC Meetings
- ERAS pilot going live June 1st with 2 provider groups with the goal to decrease the number of patients discharged home with prescribed opioids
- 2019 ER physicians and hospitalists MAT trained to provide treatment for obstetric patients

- The 5 Ps and follow up questions are utilized in EPIC. "Yes" to any follow up questions will trigger an automatic order for social work consult
- Five out of the seven provider offices are utilizing the 5 Ps screening tool

MNO Checklist and Guidelines for Mothers And Newborns with OUD are located in Triage, Labor, and Mother-Baby

Education Campaign

- 100% of all our nurses and providers have been in-serviced on the MNO project and goals, including didactic
- Lunch and Learn presentations for all 7 of our OB clinics, identifying a nurse champion for each office
- These sessions included reviewing the key opportunities for improvement, OUD stats for Illinois, screening vs. testing, reducing stigma, SBIRT, 5 Ps, OUD clinical checklist, NAS, ESC, and billing workflow, and standard documentation
- Each office was given a binder that included the tools they would use including the 5 Ps and follow up questions, brief interview with readiness ruler, SBIRT algorithm, pre-printed MNO fax referral for Linden Oaks, OUD clinical care checklist, all handouts with PDF files for reprinting, and billing information
- When a patient is identified with OUD in the office, the MFM nurse coordinates with the Neonatal team, MNO team and Social Work

Monthly Review of all OUD Cases

To date, we have had 6 OUD admissions. . If a patient is admitted with OUD, the patient is discussed in our multidisciplinary huddle.

OUD Protocol for Providers

OB Providers and On-Call OB Hospitalists

- Review and use the OUD Checklist- in your Flowsheets
- Review ILPMP
- MFM, Neo, Anesthesia consults
- Labs: Prenatal labs, Rapid HIV, HEP-C, CMP, Urine- tox screen
- Social Work Consult for all Inpatients
- Referral to Linda Heulke at Linden Oaks for Outpatients if patient is in agreement
- Call Illinois DocAssist for assistance in the initiation of Medication-assisted Treatment
- Discuss Narcan and provide RX
- Document in Problem List
- If delivered, offer Birth Control and early postpartum visit

OUD clinical consult warm-line ILPQC now open for OB providers

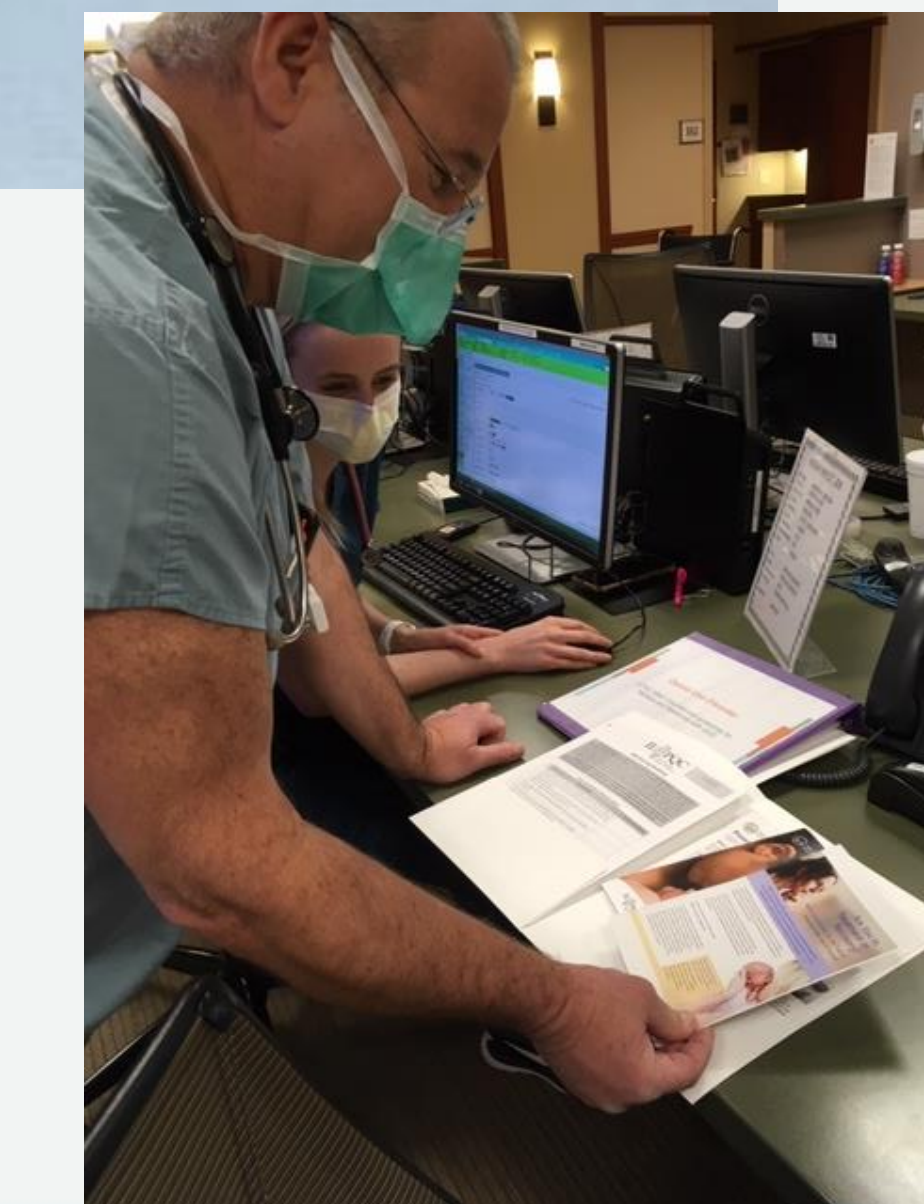
