

# COVID-19 PPE Requirements per CDC Guidelines



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**Applies to all hospital and ambulatory settings.**

	PPE required for providers entering patient room or with direct patient contact					PPE for Patient
	GOWN 	PROCEDURAL /SURGICAL MASK 	EYE PROTECTION 	RESPIRATOR (PAPR/N95/P100) 	NEGATIVE PRESSURE ROOM (when available)	MASK 
<b>Patients without respiratory symptoms.</b>						
Inside patient room						
Colleagues in patient care areas or ambulating or transporting patients outside of room						
<b>Interaction with a patient with respiratory symptoms (cough, shortness of breath, sore throat). NOTE: In hospital setting, place in droplet isolation</b>						
While obtaining respiratory specimen (swabber)						
Direct patient contact (i.e., close contact within six feet, in-room care, patient screening)						
Transporting or ambulating patient outside of room						
<b>Interaction with a patient who is confirmed COVID-19, known PUI (person under investigation) or screened as high-risk for COVID-19. NOTE: Consider changing scrubs at the end of shift; hospital provided scrubs may be requested.</b>						
Direct patient contact (i.e., close contact within six feet, in-room care, patient screening)					For aerosol generating procedures (BiPAP, CPAP, Optiflow, EZ PAP, bronchoscopy, nasotracheal suction, intubation, nebulizer treatments)	
Ambulating patient	<b>Patient is to be confined to patient room</b>					
Transporting patient						
<b>Colleagues walking through hallways in non-patient care areas and reception/waiting areas. (A patient care area is where patients may be examined or treated.)</b>						
<b>NO PPE NECESSARY</b>						
Colleagues in groups larger than 10 where social distancing is not possible. (Social distancing is standing or sitting greater than 6 feet apart)
