# Join us for the Illinois Perinatal Quality Collaborative Third Annual Conference!

Join us to share strategies and lessons learned from perinatal quality improvement efforts across the US. We will hear updates on current Illinois perinatal quality initiatives, including Golden Hour and Birth Certificates, and launch the new state-wide Maternal Hypertension Initiative. We will discuss hot topics in both obstetric and neonatal quality including: efforts to reduce maternal morbidity and mortality, patient and family engagement, building sustainable quality improvement, California Pre-eclampsia Toolkit, antenatal steroids, stabilization of the highrisk newborn at birth (Golden Hour), and next steps for engaging with ILPQC.

## Keynote Speaker: Sarah Kilpatrick, MD, PhD

Sarah J. Kilpatrick, MD, PhD is the Helping Hand of Los Angeles Endowed Chair in Obstetrics and Gynecology, Professor and Chair of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology and Associate Dean for Faculty Development at Cedars-Sinai. She received a BS with Honors from Newcomb College, a PhD in Biopsychology from the University of Chicago, and an MD from Tulane University School of Medicine. Dr. Kilpatrick completed a residency in obstetrics and gynecology and a fellowship in maternal-fetal medicine at the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF), where she went on to serve as faculty for eight years.

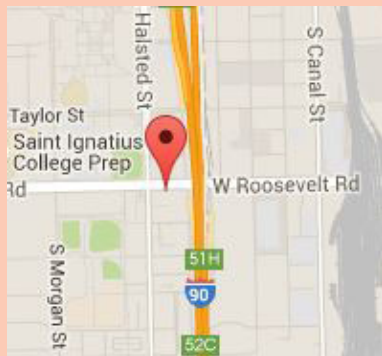
