Join us for the Illinois Perinatal Quality Collaborative Fifth Annual Conference!

Join us to share strategies and lessons learned from perinatal quality improvement (QI) efforts across the US. We will plan for sustainability of the current Severe Maternal Hypertension and Golden Hour Initiatives; discuss ILPQC initiatives starting in 2018 including Initiatives Mothers and Newborns affected by Opioids and Immediate Postpartum LARC; leverage QI success from other state Perinatal Quality Collaboratives including: sustainability of maternal hypertension and golden hour initiatives, neonatal abstinence syndrome and maternal opioid use, immediate postpartum LARC, optimizing use of 17-OHP to reduce recurrent preterm birth, and antibiotic stewardship initiatives; and next steps for engaging patients and families in quality improvement. The Key Note Address, Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome: Rethinking our Approach, will be given by Matthew Grossman, MD.



Keynote: Matthew Grossman, MD

Matthew Grossman, M.D. graduated from SUNY Stony Brook School of Medicine in 2003 and completed his pediatric residency at Yale-New Haven Children's Hospital (YNHCH) in 2006. He then became an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at Yale School of Medicine and a pediatric hospitalist. He has been the quality and safety officer for YNHCH since 2013 and his team was awarded the 2015 Pediatric Quality Award from the Children's Hospital Association for their work on improving outcomes for infants

Conference Objectives

- Describe benefits of working together on quality improvement in a perinatal quality collaborative;
- Identify successful past/present initiatives in Illinois and other states to reduce adverse perinatal outcomes;
- Plan, implement, and sustain a perinatal quality improvement project based on one's expertise;
- Identify smart aim and objectives of the ILPQC quality improvement initiatives starting in 2018.

Desired Learner Outcomes

The learner will have a better understanding of perinatal issues such as obstetric care for women with opioid use disorder in the ACOG AIM Patient Safety Bundle and opportunities to improve women's access to immediate postpartum LARC. They will gain knowledge on key components of sustainability for the Maternal Hypertension and Golden Hour Initiatives. They will have a better understanding in both nonpharmacologic treatment options for neonatal abstinence syndrome and opportunities to implement those strategies in their hospital.

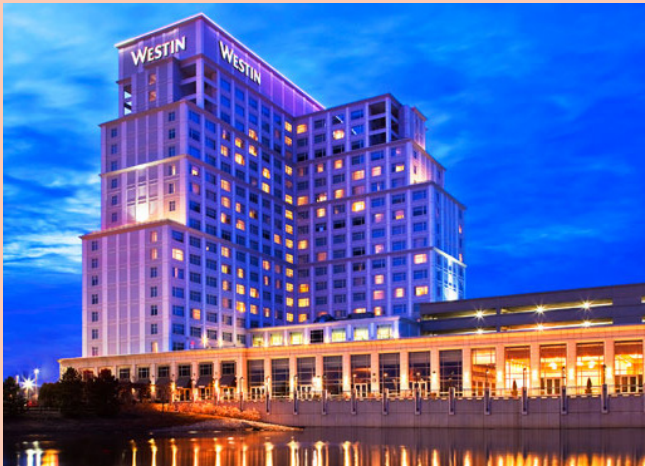
