- Delayed cord clamping rate at 80% or higher




Neonatal Golden Hour: Delivery Room Practices- DCC






Neonatal Golden Hour: Admission IL PQC Practices – Temperature and IV Glucose Quality Collaborative

Sustainability



- What metrics do we want to monitor during sustainability period?
- What are our goals for monitoring?
- 80% of deliveries will use a checklist which includes a pre-briefing with the OB and nursery team and a post-resuscitation debriefing for high-risk deliveries
- 90% of resuscitation team leaders will have introduced themselves to the mother and/ or significant other prior to delivery
- 80% of eligible infants will receive delayed cord clamping
- 80% of high-risk newborns and newborns requiring resuscitation will have a pulse oximetry signal obtained by two minutes after birth

Sustainability



- 70% of eligible neonates will be initially stabilized with non--invasive respiratory support in the delivery room
- 80% of eligible neonates will receive pulmonary surfactant within 15 minutes of intubation in the delivery room
- 90% of fathers/significant others will have experienced partnership the baby's bedside in the delivery room, transport to NICU/ SCN, and during the admission process
- 90% of infants less than 32 weeks gestation or less than 1500 grams birth weight, will have a temperature between 36.5--37.5°C upon admission to the NICU
- 80% of all infants less than 32 weeks gestation or less than 1500 grams birth weight will have intravenous access, intravenous fluids, and antibiotics infusing within one hour of admission to the NICU
