

• A baby is involved, patients may not consider a cesarean as they would any other major surgery











Placenta Accreta Spectrum




Maternal death may occur despite optimal planning, transfusion management, and surgical care (ACOG)

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Placenta accreta now affects 1 in 272 pregnancies








