

Report 1:

- Report 1 is your hospital's **Structure Measure Dashboard**. In this report, your institution's progress (*haven't started*, *working on it, in place*) are displayed for the following hospital structure measures:
 - Standardized hospital staff education about respectful care, implicit bias and anti-racism
 - Standardized hospital staff education about safe sleep environment and parent conversations
 - o Standardized practice of promoting a safe sleep environment in the hospital
 - o Policy for safe sleep practices reflective of the 2022 AAP Recommendations
 - Standardized process to use qualified interpreters in parents/caregivers' preferred language
 - Standardized process for reviewing and updating all unit policies with an equity lens
 - Parent(s) and/or caregiver(s) on the newborn quality improvement team
 - Standardized process to provide parents or caregivers culturally responsive safe sleep education
 - Standardized process to identify barriers to providing a safe sleep environment outside of hospital
 - Standardized process to provide resources to enable a safe sleep environment outside of hospital
 - Standardized process to screen for newborn inclusive SDOH and to link to needed resources
 - Standardized process for transfer of care to the newborn's community provider
 - Standardized process for the collection of parent-reported newborn race and ethnicity data
 - Standardized process to stratify/share data by birthing person's race, ethnicity, and insurance
 - Standardized process to address disparities based on review of neonatal outcomes



Report 2:

- Report 2 is your hospital's **Education Measure Dashboard**. This report allows you to visualize the percentage of staff completing education at your institution. There are four sub-categories in which education is measured: (1) Physicians and providers (2) Nurses (3) Ancillary staff, and (4) Hospital staff. In this report, you can view the following education measures:
 - Percentage of staff completing education about listening to parents and caregivers, providing respectful care and building trust, addressing implicit bias and engaging in anti-racism
 - Percentage of staff completing education about the importance of safe sleep and how to effectively educate parents or caregivers

This data is taken from your monthly **Hospital Level Data Form.**

Report 3:

Report 3 is the **Sleep Audit Dashboard.** This report includes one graph that documents the percentage of audited infants in a safe sleep environment. This information directly reflects the **Sleep Environment Audit** portion on your **Hospital Level Data Form** and distinguishes between percentages observed in the *Postpartum* and *Special Care Nursery/NICU Unit*.

Want to double check your numbers? Check the table below the graph to make sure your numerator (number of infants in a safe sleep environment) and denominator (number of infants audited) reflect your submission for that month.



Report 4:

Report 4 is the **ESSI Bundle Dashboard**. This report includes 7 graphs.

The first three graphs visualize **Total ESSI Bundle Completion**, **ESSI Bundle Completion by Race and Ethnicity, and ESSI Bundle Completion by Insurance Status.** This information is pulled from your **Patient Level Data Form**.

The next four graphs represent separate components of the ESSI Bundle: **Awareness**, **Readiness**, and **Transfer of Care**.

The Awareness component of the ESSI Bundle consists of two components and subsequently has two graphs:

- Parents or caregivers reporting an understanding of safe sleep
 - Out of all patient-level forms entered for that month, this is the percentage of charts in which there is documentation of parents or caregivers reporting an understanding of a safe sleep environment
- Documentation of a conversation with parents or caregivers about adjustment to life with a newborn and safe sleep, and resources shared
 - Out of all patient-level forms entered for that month, this is the percentage of charts in which there is documentation of (1) a conversation with parents or caregivers about adjustment to life with a newborn and safe sleep outside of the hospital and (2) resources and guidance shared with parents or caregivers

The Readiness component of the ESSI Bundle displays **SDOH Screening and Linkage.**

- SDOH Screening Out of all patient-level forms entered for that month, this is the percentage of entries in which there is documentation in the infant chart of **social** determinants of health (SDOH) screening completed.
- SDOH Linkage Out of all patient-level forms entered for that month, this is the percentage of entries in which a parent or caregiver who has SDOH needs identified has documentation of linkage to needed resources/services in the infant chart.

The last component, Transfer of Care, is that the ESSI Bundle is documented in the discharge summary. This means that the infant's discharge summary includes the following:

• Parents or caregivers report an understanding of a safe sleep environment.



- Family is prepared for a transition to home, including documentation of SDoH screening and resource linkage.
- Communication to primary care provider completed

Report 5:

Report 5 is Infant Race & Ethnicity. Among the charts audited each month, this graph will display the percentage of audited charts in which parent(s)-reported infant race and ethnicity is documented in the infant medical record. This information is taken from your **Patient Level Data Form**.

Report 6:

Report 6 includes one graph that visualizes documentation of a qualified interpreter used to provide safe sleep education to the parent or caregiver. This information is taken from your **Patient Level Data Form**.
