

10 Steps to Getting Started with ESSI

- 1. Establish leadership commitment for ESSI
- 2. Confirm that your ESSI QI team roster is complete and up-to-date
 - Include a provider and nurse lead
 - Begin brainstorming potential strategies to engage parent partners
- 3. Schedule regular ESSI QI team meetings
- 4. Review the ESSI (1) Monthly Patient and (2) Monthly Hospital Data Collection Form with your team and discuss strategies for data collection
- 5. Complete the ESSI Teams Readiness Survey if you have not done so already
- 6. Review your current safe sleep and respectful care provider, nursing, and staff education
- 7. Review Key ESSI resources including the Key Driver Diagram and the ESSI Online Toolkit
- 8. Begin the QI work by drafting a 30/60/90 day plan

Term	Definition
Readiness Survey	This survey helps your team work together to understand
	current barriers and opportunities at your hospital.
Key Driver Diagram	This diagram organizes your improvement aim, the key
	drivers or the "what" you need to accomplish that aim,
	and the change ideas or interventions, the "how", into a
	learning and communication framework. A driver diagram
	allows you to distill your vision into manageable tasks.
30-60-90 Day plan	This plan helps your team decide where to start and
	identify what you want to accomplish in the first 3
	months. Call it the "where should we start" for your ESSI
	implementation plan.
ESSI Toolkit	This toolkit is an online living document of strategies,
	resources and tools to help your hospital team implement
	the ESSI initiative.
