Join the Illinois Drug Overdose Prevention Program (DOPP)

Fentanyl is widespread and often mixed into substances without a person's knowledge. This means overdoses are sudden, unpredictable and more deadly.

As many as 10 people die every day in Illinois from overdose.

Substance use disorders are the leading cause of pregnancy-related deaths, causing 1 in 3 Illinois maternal deaths.

But it doesn't have to be this way — overdoses can be prevented and reversed.

Be part of the solution.

The Illinois Department of Human Services Division of Substance Use Prevention and Recovery (IDHS/SUPR) leads the Drug Overdose Prevention Program (DOPP) working with community partners to save lives.

Why Join DOPP?

Because every free Narcan (naloxone) kit distributed could mean:

- A parent coming home
- A second chance at recovery
- A life saved before it's too late



Simple Steps. Lifesaving Impact.

Narcan is safe, simple to use and can reverse an overdose in minutes. When it's on hand, lives are saved.

Through DOPP, organizations can:

- Order free Narcan (naloxone)
- Provide overdose education
- Distribute lifesaving free Narcan kits to patients and families with risk factors for overdose

All you have to do to participate is:

- Complete the DOPP online training about Narcan distribution and overdose education
- Report your Narcan kits distributed each month through the Illinois Saves Overdose portal
